Cake Sale





Author Malorie Blackman is visiting Worthing High School and we have been given 10 places for pupils to join in. If you are interested in coming along, please


See Miss Tilley in the LRC. Unfortunately we may not be able to take everyone that is interested so pupils will be chosen at random.



