Understanding new GCSE grades

In 2018 most GCSE subjects are now grades using a 9-1 number system rather than A*-G. In this new grading system a Grade 4 is broadly the equivalent of a C Grade and is classed a 'Standard' pass. Grade 5 is considered to be a 'Strong' pass.

Grades 7-9 cover the equivalent of the A*-A Grades with a Grade 9 being award to the very highest performing pupils.
