The Cavendish School (Eastbourne) is an exempt charity and a company limited by guarantee, registered in England and Wales with Company Number 8135372. Its registered office is at Eldon Road, Eastbourne, East Sussex BN21 1UE

Purpose

We believe that uniform instils a sense of pride in the school and promotes feelings of community. A uniform also looks smart, it sets an appropriate tone and develops a purposeful learning environment.

Our uniform has been developed in consultation with pupils, parents, local governors and the local community. A full consultation of views and concerns will take place before any amendments are made to this policy. Cost is carefully considered in deciding on uniform design and uniform suppliers, and we review contract arrangements with suppliers regularly so that parents continue to get value for money. Sustainability is considered carefully when sourcing all items of compulsory uniform.

Aims

Our uniform is a positive expression of our ethos in "Believing in Excellence" and values. The wearing of our uniform should encourage pupils to treat each other and the school environment with respect. It should support pupils in learning how to dress in a manner appropriate to the activity being undertaken and promote the learning environment within the school.

Communication with Parents

This policy is available on the school website. Prospective parents are sent clear guidance on uniform well in advance of the admission of their child. Pupils and parents will be notified of the uniform requirements via letters, newsletters, pupil planners, induction packs and the school website.

Equal Opportunities

To promote inclusion and engagement with the school, pupils will be required to wear uniform items for dayto-day wear as well as in some specialist subjects, such as PE. We will seek to make appropriate arrangements to reflect the requirements of different religious faiths with regards to acceptable variations of the school uniform. We are sensitive to and demonstrate a respect for the needs of different cultures, races and religions, and their needs are accommodated within this policy.

Health and Safety

Any religious variations to our uniform must still comply with our Health and Safety requirements. Health and Safety is considered in relation to appropriate dress codes for all pupils. To promote a healthy lifestyle, our uniform does not preclude walking or cycling to school. Pupils are permitted to wear light colours and reflective materials over their uniform, so that pupils are as visible as possible when walking or cycling to school during the winter months.

Procedure in the event of non-compliance

Non-compliance with the uniform policy is investigated directly case by case. We may impose sanctions for breach of the uniform policy. The school will hold a stock of uniform and if a pupil is not in correct uniform they will be expected to wear the uniform provided.

Persistent flouting of the uniform requirements will be dealt with as a disciplinary matter by the Progress Leader or Assistant Headteacher. We may ask a pupil to go home to change their clothes. This will be for no longer than is necessary to effect the change of clothing and would only be appropriate where the change could be made quickly and easily. In such cases parents will be notified. We will always bear in mind the age and vulnerability of the child and availability of a parent.

Exclusion is not usually an appropriate response to breaches of this policy, except where persistent and defiant.

Monitoring and Evaluation

- The school will conduct uniform checks to ensure compliance, and will report the statistics to Governors.
- There will be an annual review of supply arrangements and costs.
- The level of financial support provided will be reported to the Governors on an annual basis.

Additional Guidance

- The uniform will be reviewed annually by the Headteacher, in consultation with Governors, pupils and parents. (Uniform requirements are itemised below).
- Full school uniform must be worn to and from school on school days, and on day-time visits, away sports fixtures and by pupils on duty at school functions. Uniform regulations may be relaxed on school trips, at the discretion of the Headteacher.
- The decision to vary school uniform in the light of weather changes lies at the discretion of the Headteacher.
- Pupils are not allowed to cover piercings (e.g with plasters) and may not use sleepers. Parents who want their children to have facial piercings should have these done at the beginning of the summer holidays so that studs, rings, sleepers can be removed during the school day. The school takes the view that facial piercings can be dangerous and easily become infected.
- School will operate a hardship fund to help pay for uniform in cases of need in line with the school Financial Support Policy.
- Uniform requirements will be enforced by all staff.
- Progress Leaders will lead Form Tutors, in the Secondary Phase, in the enforcement of standards. In the Primary Phase the Class Teachers will enforce the standards.
- School actively discourages pupils from having tattoos. Should pupils have a tattoo they must not be visible.
- PE kit is also a requirement and details are published below

N.B. The policy aims to cover all aspects of uniform and standards of presentation for pupils. If an unforeseen issue arises the Headteacher has the right, in consultation with the governors, to waive or introduce new expectations.

The school leadership team and governors reserve the right to enforce school standards, monitor compliance and act as final decision makers of what is and is not acceptable uniform.

Hairstyles

Long hair must be tied up neatly for school. Only a simple coloured band or headband is permitted. Bows and other ornate headbands are not allowed to be worn in school.

General Appearance

The tie must be tied in such a way that the school logo is visible just below the knot.

Jewellery and make-up

Only one small stud in each ear is permitted. No piercing in the inner part of the ear. Jewellery that stretches the earlobe is not permitted No facial or visible body piercings. No bracelets or rings. A wristwatch is allowed No visible make-up is to be worn, including coloured nail varnish or false eye lashes No long nails or extensions

Hairstyles

Extreme hairstyles are not permitted in the School. "Carved/cut designs" are not permitted. Both boys and girls should not have any bright coloured hair dye added to their natural colour.

BAGS: Pupils are required to carry their equipment in a school bag/rucksack. Bags should be big enough to comfortably hold A4 folders and books.
