This is a key priority for next year.</p> <p>Term 1 Pupil voice at the start of the year showed 40% of students <u>did not</u> enjoy PE lessons. It also highlighted 42% of children stating that they <u>do not</u> exercise outside of school hours.</p> <p>Term 5 Pupil voice showed that 85% always enjoyed PE which is an increase from the start of the year.</p> <p>Sports Crew Training: Sports Crew training has happened and the sports crew were outside all last year. Pupils liked taking part and there were plenty of children choosing to take part. More effective in the lower KS. Insufficient evidence of targeting the least active so this will be a priority for next year.</p> <p>Booster Swimming Lessons: Booster swimming has taken place and analysis of progress towards the target of 85%-90% of pupils will be able to swim 25m by the end of year 6 July 2021.</p> <p>By the end of Term 6 2019, 69% of Year 4 and 5 children who had met 2 or all of the 3 competency objectives for swimming.</p> <p>This data shows that we are on track to achieve our target by the end of 2021 for swimming.</p> <p>Golden Mile: This was very successful in KS1 but less so in KS2 due to the logistics and timing. Assessment data was very difficult to analyse but it showed KS1 moved from 25% completion rate to an 86% completion rate. KS2 move from 32% to an 80% completion rate.</p>
